



PLAN FOR EMERGENCIES

BBR Police and Fire Departments provide immediate emergency services during the normal course of events. During an emergency, Ranch management implements the BBR Emergency Plan, in conjunction with the Fire and Police Departments.

SIGN UP FOR DESCHUTES COUNTY EMERGENCY ALERTS

You will be the first to know the latest fire updates. Be sure to use your Black Butte Ranch physical address, and include local and cell phone numbers.

EVACUATION LEVELS

LEVEL 1 BE READY

NOTE: These descriptions have been updated to match Deschutes County guidelines.

LEVEL 1: means “**BE READY**” for potential evacuation. Residents should be aware of the danger that exists in their area, monitor emergency services websites and local media outlets for information. This is the time for preparation and precautionary movements of persons with special needs, mobile property and (under certain circumstances) pets and livestock. If conditions worsen, emergency services personnel may contact you via an emergency notification system.

LEVEL 2 GET SET

LEVEL 2: means “**GET SET**” to evacuate. You must prepare to leave at a moment’s notice. This level indicates there is significant danger to your area, and residents should either voluntarily relocate to a shelter or with family and friends outside of the affected area, or if choosing to remain, to be ready to evacuate at a moment’s notice. Residents MAY have time to gather necessary items, but doing so is at their own risk. This may be the only notice you receive. Emergency services cannot guarantee that they will be able to notify you if conditions rapidly deteriorate. Area media services will be asked to broadcast periodic updates.

LEVEL 3 GO

LEVEL 3: means “**GO**” evacuate now. Leave immediately! Danger to your area is current or imminent, and you should evacuate immediately. If you choose to ignore this advisement, you must understand that emergency services may not be available to assist you further. DO NOT delay leaving to gather any belongings or make efforts to protect your home. This will be the last notice you receive.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Ranch’s “Emergency Preparedness Plan” would be put into effect by all Ranch departments. All recreation and other facilities will close immediately, and people in these areas will be asked to return to their residence and/or evacuate.

A family plan for emergencies should be in place at all times. Items to discuss might include:

- ◆ Choose a location on the Ranch to meet if you become separated during your stay.
- ◆ Know your BBR street address, lot number, phone #.
- ◆ Know your family’s cell phone numbers. Keep them charged and with you at all times.
- ◆ Know the name and number of a family friend or relative to call and check in with if you become separated.
- ◆ Place business records, check books, wallets, computer discs, passports, address files, etc. in a portable container where they can be quickly retrieved prior to an evacuation.
- ◆ Keep vital medications on hand in a carrying case.
- ◆ Prioritize irreplaceable family items such as photos, albums, diaries, coin or stamp collections, paintings, etc., so that you know ahead of time what you will take as you leave. Replaceable items that are covered by fire insurance are not normally on a priority list.

EMERGENCY HOME PREPARATION

- ◆ If time permits, the BBR Rural Fire District recommends taking the following steps to secure a home for evacuation:
- ◆ Tape a list to the front door with your name and the phone number where you can be reached after evacuation. List anything that may be important for fire fighters, such as the existence and location of propane, pressurized tanks, unusual wiring systems, or flammable and hazardous materials.
- ◆ Leave the doors LOCKED.
- ◆ Close and lock windows and doors. Close interior doors.
- ◆ Move drapes and flammable furniture away from all windows. Close metal and non-fabric blinds. Leave screens on.
- ◆ Close or cover exterior attic or eave vents with plywood, metal, soaking wet towels or blankets. This is particularly important to avoid smoke infiltration.
- ◆ Turn off all above ground propane tanks.
- ◆ Do not turn off electricity—leave the lights on.
- ◆ If the roof has wood shakes or shingles, place a connected garden hose and sprinklers on the roof ridge cap. Do not turn on the sprinklers.
- ◆ Leave vehicles in the garage facing out; leave the windows rolled up, unlocked, with keys left in the ignition. Have the car packed with your necessities, and irreplaceable items. Close the garage windows and the main door and leave the garage door unlocked.
- ◆ Evacuate in a timely manner when advised to. **Search and Rescue** personnel go door to door to evacuate the Ranch. Depart the Ranch as directed by officials. Owners and guests will be allowed back to the Ranch, only after the emergency is over. Keep your BBR Owners card and ID with you.
